

Good evening members of the Buller District Council.

My name is and I will be speaking at Public Forum during next Wednesday's Council meeting about Heavy Transport Vehicles travelling on Roebuck Street. However, I have enclosed some background and comments about this issue which I hope you will have time to read before the meeting.

BACKGROUND

In February 2011, Council resolved to establish two heavy transport bypass routes through Westport as follows:

- 1. Brougham, Domett, Mill and Palmerston Streets (towards Northern Buller), and
- 2. Queen, Mill and Palmerston Streets (inland towards the Nine Mile).

This reflected the designations in Buller District Council's District Plan which label Mill and Queen Streets as arterial and collector routes respectively.

However, the signage placed on our local streets at the time only related to the northbound traffic not the inland route.

in 2013 I submitted to the 2013/14 Annual Plan requesting Council act to reduce the heavy transport traffic on Roebuck/Menzies Streets and Council resolved to send annual letters to major contractors requesting them where possible to use Queen and Mill Streets. However, these letters were only sent in 2015 and 2016.

2022/23 ANNUAL PLAN

Last year and I lodged a submission to the 2022/23 Annual Plan (along with submissions from some of our neighbours) because of the disturbance the large truck and trailer units continued to cause along our small residential street.

I have attached my written submission which requested Council action to restrict the movement of heavy transport through traffic along Roebuck and Menzies Streets be included in the Roading programme for 2022/23. We also asked for signs to be installed that clearly direct large trucks away from Menzies and Roebuck Streets and instead along Mill and Queen.

In my submission I also raised two "urban myths" that I had encountered, these being:

- 1. Roebuck Street was upgraded to accommodate heavy transport when the new Buller Bridge was built, and
- 2. Holcim paid for the street to be upgraded.

Neither of these myths are true. What did occur? Roebuck Street was reconstructed by the Council during the 1980/81 financial year to the same specifications as any other residential street at the time.

After and I spoke to our submissions on this topic we left the Council Hearing meeting feeling Councillors were supportive of our situation. In July 2022, I received a letter from Council which states:

"Signs will be changed accordingly, and an audit undertaken to ensure that suitable measures are in place. Notification has been issued to transport companies requesting that drivers only use the set routes. Council also agreed to the trial of some traffic calming measures."

PROGRESS DURING 2022/23

Since receiving this letter, I have been very disappointed with the progress made by Council staff on this matter. The signage has not been clear, and it is either not seen or is misinterpreted as relating to the other bypass by many of the truck drivers.

Some local operators and drivers continue to use Roebuck/Menzies Streets to and from the Buller Bridge, along with out-of-town drivers who do not understand the signage due to its placement.

During November and December 2022 and January 2023, Council staff have told me that:

- an average of 21 Heavy Vehicles passing my home per day is acceptable, noting that mathematically this means some days there are more.
- the detrimental effect of the noise from the trucks is just my view even though three other households in Roebuck Street presented similar views to the Annual Plan.
- · Council files note the road was upgraded to specifications with no details of these specifications provided when requested.
- the road has been assessed as suitable for the traffic loading but no details of the scope of this assessment or the methodology provided when requested.
- I have driven along Roebuck Street and the road surface seems fine which does not remotely compare to sitting in my home while a truck and trailer unit carting rocks travels past.
- currently vehicles are able to use the route and no change is planned for this area I note this preceded the March 2023 traffic count.

In January 2023, and I meet with Rachel Townrow and Mike Williams to express our concern regarding progress on restricting heavy transport vehicles on our street. At this point, in addition to the signage and letters that had resumed, had been stopping and talking to each truck driver that travelled down Roebuck Street to explain about the bypass and to give them a photocopy of the Council letter. He continues to do this.

At this meeting Mike advised the traffic calming structures could not be done because there was no funding from Waka Kotahi specifically for this, but suggested road safety concerns would be considered by them when allocating funding.

However, he did commit to:

- instructing his staff to engage with about more effective placement of additional signage on Palmerston and Queen Streets, and
- providing me with suitable contact details at Waka Kotahi to engage directly with them.

Following the meeting I sent an email to Mike outlining the safety issues relating to the vulnerable users of Roebuck Street and advised that Council's Revenue and Financing Policy allowed for 100% Council funding for traffic calming structures of the nature we were requesting.

To date has not had any contact from the Transportation team and I have not received the Waka Kotahi contact details.

I do not understand why I need to re-litigate the adverse effects of heavy transport traffic on my family, my neighbours and our homes with staff members when Council has already resolved to trial traffic calming structures during the 2022/23 Annual Plan deliberations, as outlined by the letter we received dated 30 June 2022.

TRAFFIC COUNT REPORT - WEDNESDAY 31 MAY 2023

At Wednesday's Council meeting you will receive a report from the Transportation team advising the current management practices have been successful and traffic calming structures are not required in Roebuck Street.

The report states:

- that signage is clear however this has not been the feedback received from truck drivers and there is no sign that directs traffic away from either Menzies or Roebuck Streets.
- The mean average speed along Roebuck Street is lower than 50km/hour which mathematically indicates there is a range of speeds at the point on the street where the traffic counter was installed and does not align to the issue we have asked to be resolved which is the overall disturbance to residents caused by heavy transport through traffic.
- A recent network survey did not indicate any substrate failures of Roebuck Street yet although the Council paper provides the results and additional analysis of the traffic counts there is no data provided about the scope, methodology and results of this survey.
- Any improvements will be exclusively funded by rates however Council's Revenue and Financing Policy lists funding options on work of the nature requested to include general rates, loans or investments.

TRAFFIC COUNT DATA

The considerations in the report include traffic count data from three time periods of June 16th to July 2nd 2022, September 29th to October 13th 2022, and March 15th to 22nd 2023. The traffic count table shows that average heavy transport traffic has fluctuated at all data measurement sites over time. It also shows that Queen Street has more heavy transport traffic which is appropriate as it is the bypass route and will be engineered for this purpose.

l am unsure how to interpret the graph on page 31 as the key and horizontal axis are not well defined. However, it would be expected that traffic volumes would decline overnight as per the graph that plots average data comparing Roebuck Street to the bypass on Queen Street – please note that there are some residents on our street who are retired and some who work from home.

Unfortunately, there is no traffic data provided from a comparable small street in Westport like Stout Street or Salisbury Street.

CONTROLLING TRAFFIC FLOW AND TRAFFIC CALMING STRUCTURES

The existing traffic signs have not been effective as we continue to have milk tankers, livestock truck and trailer units, machinery transporters (including a mix of local and out of town companies) using Roebuck Street as evidenced in the traffic counts.

The annual letters have only recommenced because my request for records about them established their mail out had ceased.

I am not seeking measures that will reduce average speeds but request the <u>Traffic Management and Control</u> section on page 37 be put into effect to restrict heavy transport through traffic from using Roebuck Street as a short cut to and from the Buller Bridge to Queen Street. I have previously raised the inability of the large trucks to turn into or out of Roebuck Street without crossing onto the approaching lanes and the safety issues related to this and the pedestrian entrance to the Westport Domain. The temporary traffic calming structure outlined from the 2022/23 submission process would test the effectiveness of this strategy for less cost than a permanent structure. I hope that unlike the signs installed there will be genuine engagement with me and the other Annual Plan submitters over the design of this.

I consider the comment about "work undertaken at Roebuck Street, unnecessarily sets precedence" as unsubstantiated. A long-established by-pass route exists to divert heavy transport vehicles away from Menzies/Roebuck Streets. Current systems in place to ensure this route is adhered to have not been effective as by Council's own measures in March 2023 we still have an <u>average</u> of 25 trucks a day (including weekends) on Roebuck Street.

I also note that resealing the street has not improve the substrate, noticeably reduced the horizontal vibrations or the intrusive noise of large trucks going b

Trucking frustration on Roebuck

A local man has resorted to waving down truck drivers in his street and imploring them to use Westport's heavy transport route instead of his narrow residential street

Roebuck Street resident Vern Wishart told councillors at a recent Buller District Council (BDC) meeting he had printed off maps of the heavy traffic route down Mill and along Queen streets and was handing them to truck drivers shortcutting through Menzies and Roebuck streets.

Mr Wishart said the road was not designed for the huge truck and trailer units travelling on it today. He had worked on its upgrade in 1980.

"We upgraded it to the standard of a normal street in town, not a heavy bypass street... They only had trucks in 1980 weighing about 12 tonnes. Now

we've got 40 and 50-tonne trucks."

There was no grass verge and no buffer zone to stop homes vibrating.

Mr Wishart said most truckers understood when he told them Roebuck had not followed through on actions Street had been compromised by the councillors committed to during last July 2021 flood and that the water table was too high. But drivers frequently changed, and he had to explain again.

"They've all been pretty good, except for a few local drivers that say, 'we've right direction and explore other traffic after last year's annual plan decision. used this street for years' and refuse... control measures. to go the other way."

Cr Phil Grafton said council's actions so far hadn't really achieved anything. Average heavy vehicle use had dropped from about 29 per day to 21.

"What's the alternative? Because traffic... there needs to be an alternative. People's houses are falling to pieces because to sit down. vehicles are just taking a shortcut ... Going by the figures, spending money on road signs doesn't seem to have changed anything a lot," Cr Grafton said.

Acting infrastructure services manager Mike Williams said physical solutions like traffic islands were

designed to keep speeds down, not deter heavy vehicles. The average speed on Roebuck Street was 40km/h.
